

## **English and Mathematics**

In accordance with Government guidelines, pupils in Early Years Foundation Stage follow the EYFS Curriculum; all other year groups follow the National Curriculum published in 2014.

At Bressingham School, when following Curriculum 2014, pupils will mostly learn the curriculum for the year group they are in. If an individual pupil is particularly able, they may learn the curriculum for a higher age group and if they have Special Educational Needs or a Disability that makes it more appropriate for them to follow the curriculum for a lower year group, then provision will be made for this, alongside intervention to accelerate their learning, to attempt to catch up with their peers. In English, this may be appropriate in word reading and spelling for some pupils; generally other aspects of English will be learnt with their peers.
