

Introduction to our Curriculum

Our Curriculum is very important to us and to our children. It is how we enable our children to learn, through having as much fun as possible!

Following consultation with children, parents, Governors and staff, our curriculum priorities or drivers are:

The curriculum in Reception follows the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum. Other year groups follow the National Curriculum published in 2014.

The children learn through cross-curricular topics in the main, with some discrete teaching when needed. We have developed 'Curriculum Maps' for Key Stage 1 (Class 2) and Key Stage 2 (Classes 3 and 4) to show when each element of the National Curriculum will be included for each class. 2015-16 is Cycle A and 2016-2017 is Cycle B, and so on. These maps are working documents and will be subject to change as the teachers develop this new curriculum, also responding to the interests of the children. We will update the maps to reflect changes.
