Covid19 Safety Measures

We still have the odd case amongst our children and families. Thank you for supporting the measures we already have in place. There are a couple of further things that we ask you to please to, to further protect our community: - many people have started to wear face coverings again on arrival and pick-up- please may you do this unless you are exempt?

please may you also respectfully distance from other families
please note that we have to continue with ventilation measures, but are mindful of how cold it is on some days- please do send your child with extra layers below their uniform if it is a cold day and they need this; they could also bring extra outer layers to go on top of their uniform if needed

- please continue to test using lateral flow tests if you *don't* have symptoms and PCR tests if you *do* have symptoms. Anyone living with someone who has tested positive should also have a PCR test - please may children bring more than one water bottle if they may need it- this is the most hygienic way of ensuring they have enough water at the moment

The Nativity is coming soon...Years R, 1 and 2 are busy practising for their Nativity play and we very much hope that we will be able to do live performances to small groups- 2 supporters from each family, with different year groups' supporters coming to different performances. Please note that only 2 supporters per family will be allowed to come, as we are keeping numbers low, to try to reduce risk to all, including the children performing. The only exception is for 'babes in arms' (below 1 year old).

Please remember to give the children performing extra layers to wear underneath to keep them warm, and to dress warmly yourself, as ventilation will be important too. Thank you.

If we have to cancel the live performances for any reason, we hope to film the Nativity so that parents can watch. We very much hope that the live performances can go ahead.

Christmas cards- as we did last year, we will ask anyone who wishes to bring cards in to post them in the school post box before Wednesday 8th December. This will enable us to quarantine them, sort them and quarantine them again before they are given out to children. Thank you.

Christmas jumper day is always enjoyed by the children, with children wearing their Christmas jumper with their other uniform. This will take place on the last day of term, Friday 17th December.

Carols on the field? Following the success of Harvest on the field and Remembrance on the playground, we are hoping that we can have a Christmas carol event on the field ^(C) If we can't for any reason, we will swap to a Zoom event. There will be more information about *Carols on the field (or Zoom)* nearer the time.

The Big Norfolk Festive Holiday Fun activity programme provides holiday activities for children and young people aged 5-16 (or 4 if your child is slightly younger but in school) in Norfolk.

This winter, the majority of sessions will take place 20-23 December across the county, with a few exceptions taking place the following week.

All children may take part in Big Norfolk Festive Holiday Fun activities. Some activities are reserved for those with a code, while others have a mix of paid spaces and free spaces. The free spaces are reserved for children who are eligible for means-tested free school meals. Children who do not receive means-tested free school meals can still sign up to many exciting activities for a small fee.
