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Evaluation for 2020/21

In 2020/21 there were no statutory assessments due to Covid 19; 1 pupil was on track to achieve at greater depth within the expected standards (+), one was not on track but making huge steps of progress and one had had extended absence due to illness; the latter 2 children were also on the SEN register. All were affected by Covid19 lockdowns.

PP attendance data is not included this year, due to Covid 19; 1 pupil had low attendance (excluding Covid19).
