Classes for next year

It is exciting to be thinking about September and new classes. Although we still don't know exactly where all the classes will be, as this depends on the guidance that is current for Covid19, we do know who will be

teaching which classes and would like to share this with you:

Rabbits (Y1) Mrs Lewis

Kestrels (Y5 and Y6) Mrs Waller and Mrs Andrew (continuing with 2 teachers on most mornings and further TA support)

We will also have our wonderful team of classroom and teaching assistants to work with the children: Mrs Fisher, Ms Buckland, Mrs Neve, Mrs Corbyn, Mrs Grottick and Mrs Molden.

For transition, our current Year R children will have some time with Mrs Lewis in their classroom and then with her in the classroom we plan for them to use (the current Year 1 classroom), and our current Year 2 children will have some time with Miss Goddard in their current classroom. Mrs Ives will be visiting to spend some time with current Year 1 in *their* current classroom. Year 6s have had some transition from High School. This has been much more limited than usual, but has been more than the Year 6 children had last year.

We feel that it will benefit many of our children to be staying with the same teachers as they won't have that 'getting to know you' time in September- they will be able to leap into learning. This is especially useful when many
